January 15th marks the 60th Anniversary of Operation Van Buren during the Vietnam War. The Operation was led by the 101st Airborne Division of the US Army with support from the South Korean 2nd Marine Division. Operation Van Buren would last until February 25th with its main objective being to secure the rice growing region of the Tuy Hòa Valley which had been under the control of the People's Army of Vietnam and the Vietcong for over a year. Heavy fighting would commence throughout the entire operation and would result in a Victory for the US. 55 Americans were killed during the operation. Please take a moment to honor the sacrifices our Father's and Grandfather's made in 1966.
